Communities are being increasingly encouraged to take an active role in the management of their neighbourhoods, villages and parishes. This free conference will provide the opportunity for existing local history and archaeology groups to discuss how they can directly contribute to the management of the historic environment.

The programme is still to be confirmed, but will include presentations by representatives of the existing Community Archaeology North Somerset group, the Brislington Community Archaeology Group, the Friends of St Andrew's Park Group and the Fishponds Local History Group. These groups will all provide examples of how local interest and research projects can contribute to a better understanding of the historic environment and the safeguarding of local heritage.

The conference is intended for anyone with an interest in the heritage of Bristol and the wider region.

The mini conference is being organised by City Design Group as part of the English Heritage funded Bristol Historic Web Map Project. This project is a partnership between the HER, Bristol Museums, Galleries and Archives and local history and archaeology groups in Bristol. The aim of the project is to provide access to historic map archives and enable local groups to add local historic information to the HER to better manage the City's heritage.
